### MSME Financing Gateway launched in two EAC countries

The MSME Financing Gateway, an innovative digital platform designed to tackle the unique challenges MSMEs face in securing financing. Developed by ITC as part of the first phase of the EU-EAC Market Access Upgrade Programme (MARKUP), funded by the European Union, the Gateway has now been launched, under the second phase of the MARKUP programme, at two events in Kenya and Uganda.

In Kenya, it will be hosted by the Kenya Private Sector Alliance (KEPSA) in Kenya and Private Sector Foundation Uganda (PSFU) in Uganda.

The MSME Financing Gateway in Uganda aligns with the EU funded SB4U platform.

# Progressing towards simplification of export procedures in Rwanda

MARKUP II organised in collaboration with the Rwanda Revenue Authority (RRA) a simplification workshop to examine new proposals to simplify coffee, avocado, and horticulture export procedures in Rwanda.

It built on the work initiated in 2021 during the first simplification workshop that helped identify the reforms needed to reduce steps in export procedures, as mapped on the Rwanda Trade Portal. Read more.

A diverse cohort of professionals from environmental sustainability, energy and the coffee sectors attended Training of Trainers workshops in Kenya and Rwanda.
